Event: Winter Storm Watch

Date: March 5, 2013

Pertinent weather information:

The National Weather Service is advising of a possible winter weather event of snow/rain beginning Tuesday evening until Thursday morning. There is some uncertainty with this storm and a lot depends on exactly where the freezing temperature line will be. A difference of 1 to 2 degrees will change the type of precipitation. The current prediction:

- Rain will begin tonight and may switch over to wet snow on Wednesday.
- On Wednesday snow with periods of rain.
- The possibility of 4 inches of snow.
- The wet heavy snow sticking on power lines and trees may cause some fallen limbs and power lines causing isolated power outages.
- Winds expected to be 20-25 mph with higher gusts.
- The storm should be out sometime 0n Thursday.

Recommended protective action:

- This snow will be wet and heavy; a possibly of downed electrical lines and tree limbs.
- Please bring your pets inside for their protection.

General Recommendations:

Periods of snow and snow mix will cause travel difficulties, be prepared for slippery roads and limited visibilities, use caution while driving.
