Sec. 2 Rate of Taxation on Real Property

That the rate of taxation on real property to be taxed within the boundaries of the Town of Denton, Maryland shall be and hereby is established as:

~~Seventy-five cents (\$.75)~~ *Seventy-seven cents (\$.77)*

on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of the value for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018 and including June 30, 2019.

Sec. 3 Rate of Taxation on Business Personal Property

That the rate of taxation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018 and including June 30, 2019, on any incorporated personal property to be taxed by the Town of Denton, Maryland, shall be and hereby is established as:

(One Dollar and Fifty cents (\$1.50))

on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation, unless otherwise provided for by Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

Sec. 4 Rate of Taxation on Railroad and Utility Property

That the rate of taxation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018 and including June 30, 2019 on any railroad and utility property to be taxed by the Town of Denton, Maryland, shall be and hereby is established as:

One Dollar and Seventy cents (\$1.70)

on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation, unless otherwise provided for by Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

Sec. 5 Service and Administration Fee Collected by Caroline County Tax Office






That the rate of service and administrative fees on semi-annual billings assessed by the Caroline County Tax Office shall be and hereby is established as:

.42% service fee 2018 - 2019. The fee and admin charge amount to .42%. This is computed at 1.5% annual interest divided by twelve months times three months, October, November & December times 1.1% for the admin fee.

It's Boat Ramp Permit Season

Boating season is here. Just a reminder, effective April 1, 2009, a permit is required to launch any vessel, via boat trailer, at all Caroline County boat ramps and public landings.

Permits may be purchased for one day use or annual use and vary in price.

A one day pass for Maryland residents is \$5 and \$10 for out of state residents. Annual pass fees are \$20 for Maryland residents and \$50 for out of state residents. Annual permits are valid only when



displayed on the driver's side of the boat trailer tongue, within 12 inches of the hitch. Daily permits must be hung on the inside mirror facing the windshield. Fines for a first offense are \$50, and a second offense is \$100.

Permits are available at the Denton Town Office, Caroline County Recreation and Parks Office, Caroline Co. Planning and Codes Office, Bullocks Deli, Denton Pharmacy, Caroline Co. Tax Office.

Special Event Request Form Info.

Frequently civic organizations plan special events or celebrations such as parades and block parties in Denton. Groups planning an event are required to complete a Special Events Request Form available from the Town Office, or Police Department. Forms are also available for download at www.dentonpublicworks.com.

Applicants are requested to submit their applications at least 60 days prior to their proposed event. This allows the Police and Public Works Departments to schedule employees to provide any assistance needed.

New Trash Service Starts in July

As we start with a new Waste Contractor, Eastern Shore Environmental, LLC, the Town is trying to eliminate the chronic problems with the household trash collections.

Code Officers will be increasing enforcement at first with notices, then issuing fines as necessary to address the problem.

As a reminder, per Town Code:

- Refuse containers must be water tight, made of metal or plastic, with handles and tight-fitting covers. No fifty-gallon drums will be permitted. (waste wheelers preferred)

- Max. (4) cans per residence, with a total of up to 128 gal. capacity.

- Special free collection is available for newspapers, bundled or bagged, & broken down, flattened

bundled cardboard boxes.

- Approved bulk items can be collected with the purchase of a pick-up ticket. You MUST call the Town Office @ 410.479.2050 to arrange for pickup of any free or approved bulk items (\$5 fee)

- Trash should be placed at the curb by 6am on collection day but should not be placed prior to 5pm on the day before collection.

NO CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS, LOOSE BAGS OR LOOSE TRASH WILL BE PICKED UP.

Eastern Shore Environmental, LLC will be offering bi-weekly recycling collection, including container, to Town residents for a separate fee of \$8.00 per month. They can also offer waste wheelers at a discounted price. Please contact them directly at 410.829.1717

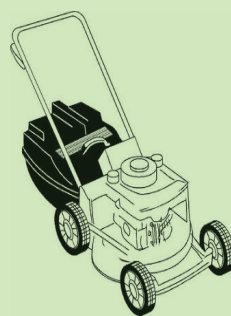

Disposing of Medication Properly

What Is the Best Method to Dispose of Medications?

Medications include prescription drugs such as hormones, antidepressants, and antibiotics; over-the-counter medications such as aspirin, ibuprofen, cold/flu remedies, and antiseptics; and veterinary medicines should be disposed of properly.

Studies have found trace amounts of medications in streams, rivers, and lakes across the country.

Medications enter these water bodies from various sources that include animal feedlots, land application of organic materials, and wastewater treatment plants that treat residential, commercial, and industrial wastewater.

It can be a challenge to get rid of unused, unwanted, or expired medications.

Increasingly scientists are warning us not to flush unwanted medications down the toilet. This becomes a problem because wastewater treatment plants were not designed to remove drugs and personal care products.

The major concerns regarding the presence of medications in surface water bodies have been an increased bacterial resistance to antibiotics and interference with the growth and reproduction in frogs and fish.

Aquatic organisms are sensitive

to low levels of exposure and are particularly vulnerable when exposed before birth and during the juvenile growth stages.

The level of risk to humans is still being studied. New medications being manufactured constantly lead to an increased usage, especially by the elderly. At this point, the long-term effect of pharmaceuticals in the environment is unknown, but there is a potential for harm. To avoid possible environmental damage, methods to reduce or improve drug disposal are necessary.



The Environmental Protection Agency is studying whether to develop formal recommendations for disposing of old medications.

In the mean time it is suggested that capsules and pills be crushed and put back into their original containers. Add water to the solid drug and replace the child-resistant cap. Add kitty litter, sawdust, or flour to liquid drugs to discourage any unintended use. Double enclose the containers in sealable plastic bags and place in plain packaging that does not indicate the contents.

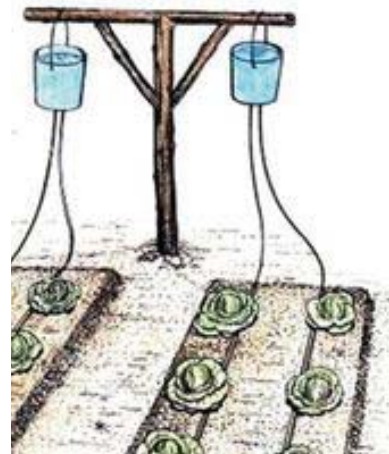
Outdoor Water Conservation

Wise use of water on your lawn and in your garden helps protect the environment and saves you money too. Residential irrigation can account for 40% of domestic water consumption in a municipality. This can become a problem especially during the summer months when the majority of outdoor water use occurs.

Simple ways of reducing the amount of water used for irrigation include growing plants that are adapted to dry conditions, mulching, adding water retaining organic matter to the soil, watering early in the morning, and installing windbreaks and fences to slow winds and reduce evaporation.

Most lawns need only one inch of water per week, either from sprinklers or rainfall. Watering deeply encourages the development of a healthy root system and reduces weed infestation. One inch of water on a 1,000 square foot yard equals about 625 gallons.

Watering early in the morning minimizes water loss to evaporation.



Drip irrigation or soaker hoses can reduce evaporation losses 20-50 percent and are excellent ways to apply water where it is needed, by avoiding watering the sidewalk, streets, or causing runoff.

Don't over water. Puddles of water and runoff definitely indicate too much water and/or that your soil is not able to absorb enough water and needs conditioning. To do any good, the water must be able to penetrate the soil. Thatch and aerate the soil. You can put off watering another day if there is heavy dew on the grass.

In the summer each of us uses about 250 gallons of water a day—that is more than twice what we use in the winter. Use only what is needed, try not to waste it.

Water conservation is not just for emergencies. Water conservation today saves you money on your next water bill, reduces the cost for developing new supplies, and leaves more water in the rivers for fish and recreation.

Town Trash and Special Pick Ups

Attention Settlement Attorneys

Reminder to all settlement attorneys and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred within the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the residents of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

Please note: Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charged may be passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00 and after 3:30p.m., the fee is \$100.00. Forms are available to use when requesting information. Any questions, please call the Town of Denton at (410) 479-2050.

Service Fees for Utility Calls

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turn ons, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

Special Attention: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)
