### **Boat Ramp Permit Season**

Boating season is here. Just a reminder, effective April 1, 2009, a permit is required to launch any vessel, via boat trailer, at all Caroline County boat ramps and public landings.

Permits may be purchased for one day use or annual use and vary in price.

A one day pass is \$10. Annual pass fees are \$25. Annual permits are valid only when displayed on the driver's side of the boat trailer tongue, within 12 inches of the hitch. Daily permits must be hung on the inside mirror facing

the windshield. Fines for a first offense are \$50, and a second offense is \$100.

Permits are available at the Denton Town Office, Caroline County Recreation and Parks Office, Caroline Co. Planning and Codes Office, Bullocks Deli, Denton Pharmacy, Caroline Co. Tax Office.



### Bike Safety

Bicycle safety is very important. Make sure your child always wears a helmet and that it fits properly.

Check the bike to make sure the brakes, reflectors and tires are working properly. Adjust the seat to your child's height.

Teach your child to check for traffic before entering a street or intersection by looking left and right.

Explain the rules of the road to your child. Bicycles

are considered vehicles and must obey the same rules as motorists.

Teach proper hand signals for left and right turn. Never allow your child to wear headphones while riding.

# SNOW PLOW POLICY INFORMATION

Planning for a winter storm event can be difficult. The variations in rate of snowfall, moisture content, air/surface temperatures, time of day, and wind velocity make each storm unique.

The purpose of this policy is to clarify and describe the Town's snow plowing and sanding priorities and the level of service that is intended to be provided by Town forces. The Town does not guarantee that streets will be free of snow and ice after plowing and/or sanding. Bare, dry pavement should not be expected. The Town will attempt to maintain adequate traction for vehicles properly equipped for winter driving conditions.

It is the goal of this effort to establish general policies and procedures that help make travel within the Town as safe as possible and to minimize economic hardship.

### **Special Collection Reminder**

Household Items: All special collection items to be picked up on Wednesdays must be called in by 12 noon on Tuesday. Effective January 1, 2003, there is a \$5.00 collection fee for each item to be collected. This fee must be paid prior to pick up date. Reminder that all mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic and sealed with tape.

<u>Yard Waste</u>: All bagged leaf and brush pickup requests must be called in by 12 noon on Tuesday for Wednesday pickup. Call all requests in to the Town Office at 410-479 -2050. Leave a message after normal business hours.

### Special Spring Loose Leaf Collection

The Town of Denton will be providing a special spring loose leaf collection service to vacuum up leaves that are left over from the fall. The Denton Public Works Department is scheduling their looseleaf removal service to occur on Monday April 4. Friday April 8, Monday April 11, Monday April 18, and Friday April 22, Monday April 25, 2022. Leaves must be bagged for pickup the remaining months of the year.

Leaf vacuuming will occur on Friday and/or Monday pending workload. It will be necessary to call in your loose-leaf vacuum pickup request by 12 NOON on Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday. We asked that you please only have one pile of leaves and have it located at the edge of your property, without obstructing sidewalks or roadways, where it can easily be accessed by Public Works.

Bagged leaf collection will still take place on Wednesdays and must be called in to the town office by 12 NOON on Tuesdays.

Citizens are encouraged to call the Town Office at 410-479-2050 to request pickup. If calling after hours please leave the requests on the Town

Office answering machine, ext. 1.

Please follow these guidelines for leaf removal:

Rake leaves to the curbside or alley

DO NOT rake leaves into the street

DO NOT rake leaves onto the sidewalk

Make sure all sticks and limbs are removed from the pile of leaves

Make sure there are no other objects or debris mixed with the leaves (like bottles, cans, flowerpots, gloves, ashes, pet waste or other trash)

Piles of leaves with sticks, limbs or other debris will not be picked up

Phone in your pickup request to the Town Office at 410-479-2050 by Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday

All pickups will be done by request/appointment only Loose leaf pickups will occur from April 4 through April 25, on Mondays and Fridays only. Leaves must be bagged any other time.

### **Electric Vehicle Incentives**

Plug-in electric vehicles offer lower operating costs and cleaner air for all Marylanders. Read below for incentives available to Maryland citizens and businesses that purchase or lease these vehicles. (Revised 7/2021)

#### I. Federal Income Tax Credit

A federal tax credit is available to buyers of new plug-in electric vehicles based on battery capacity and ranges. The credit ranges from \$2,500 to \$7,500. For model year 2021, the credit for some vehicles are as follows:

Toyota Prius Prime: \$4,502

Chrysler Pacifica, Nissan Leaf, others: \$7,500

Note that this credit, which became available in 2009, will begin to phase out once auto manufacturers meet their sales quota. (Tesla and GM have met the sales quota for this tax credit and no longer qualify for any credit)

**To get this credit:** Complete IRS Form 8936, Qualified Plug-in Electric Drive Motor Vehicle Credit and submit with your income tax return. <a href="https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8936.pdf">https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8936.pdf</a>

#### 2. Maryland Excise Tax Credit

The Maryland excise tax credit expired on June 30, 2020, but could be funded in the future.

### 3. Use of High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) Lanes

As a driver of a plug-in electric vehicle titled and registered in Maryland, you are allowed to use all HOV lanes in Maryland regardless of the number of passengers provided you obtain and display an HOV permit on the vehicle. The permit will be valid from October 1, 2010 through October 31, 2022.

#### **HOV** lanes in Maryland:

- The I-270 southbound HOV lane extends from I-370 to the Capital Beltway (I-495) in Montgomery County and is operational during the morning peak period from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.
- The I-270 northbound HOV lane operates on a 19-mile stretch from the Capital Beltway to MD 121 (Clarksburg Road) and is operational during the evening peak period from 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.
- The HOV lanes run east and west on a 7.5-mile stretch of US 50 between the Capital Beltway (I-95 / I-495) and US 301 (Crain Highway) in Prince George's County and are in operation 24 hours /day.

#### 4. Rebates for Charging Stations

Plug-in electric vehicles can be charged through regular 120-volt household electrical outlets (known as Level 1 charging), 240-volt systems (Level 2 charging) and higher voltage DC Fast Charge stations. Rebates are available for all of these charging systems and cover 40 percent of the equipment and installation cost up to a limit (\$700 for residential and \$4,000 for commercial) for systems purchased and installed between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022. Maryland's utility companies also offer their customers rebates of up to \$300 for certain Level 2 residential chargers. Grants are also available for solar photovoltaic canopies installed at parking garages where the array is charging at least four electric vehicle charging stations.

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turned on, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

Special Attention: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)

### Attention Settlement Attorneys

Reminder to all settlement attorney's and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred with in the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the resident's of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

Please note: Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charged maybe passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00 and after 3:30 PM the fee is \$100.00.
