Good Will Opens in Denton



On March 29, 2019 Goodwill Industries of the Chesapeake, Inc. held a grand opening event in Denton. The Goodwill retail store and donation center is located in Denton Plaza at route 404 and Legion Rd.

There was a line of over 100 peole by 9a.m. that morning to shop at the store.

Dignitaries from the town,

county, and state joined in to celebrate the store opening.

The store will be open Monday though Saturday 9a.m.-9p.m. and Sunday 11a.m. until 6p.m.

This is the 3rd retail store Goodwill has on the Eastern Shore and will create 15 jobs in Caroline County. Residents will be able to donate unwanted clothing and household items at the location as well.

Last year they handled over 39,000 calls for service, an increase of 3,406 since the previous year.



It's Boat Ramp Permit Season

Boating season is here. Just a reminder, effective April 1, 2009, a permit is required to launch any vessel, via boat trailer, at all Caroline County boat ramps and public landings.

Permits may be purchased for one day use or annual use and vary in price.

A one day pass for Maryland residents is \$5 and \$10 for out of state residents. Annual pass fees are \$20 for Maryland residents and \$50 for out of state residents. Annual permits are valid only when

displayed on the driver's side of the boat trailer tongue, within 12 inches of the hitch. Daily permits must be hung on the inside mirror facing the windshield. Fines for a first offense are \$50, and a second offense is \$100.

Chicken Keeping Ordinance

A number of residents have inquired about raising chickens (hens) within town limits in their backyards. As a result, the Town Council is considering an Ordinance in May to make this legal within the town limits.

C u r r e n t l y chickens are considered livestock and are not permitted in the town limits. Once the ordinance is passed (Ordinance #698) people that wish to keep chickens may apply for a permit.

There are limitations as to how many chickens, (no roosters) how much space is needed in the yard, disposal of waste, and how to house them.



The Caroline Mentoring Project has served Caroline County youth since 1998. The YMCA of the Chesapeake fully supports the program through contributions to the annual campaign. This project is also supported through numerous Caroline County businesses through partnerships and collaboration. Community involvement and awareness is a product of the mentor-mentee relationship.

The mentoring project provides young people an opportunity to develop a structured, trusting relationship with caring adults who offer guidance, support, and encouragement. This program is designed to develop competence and character in our mentees.

SinceMarch2019, the mentoring program has a new coordinator, Mr. Angel Perez who for 10 months has been working with the community creating events and programs such as: Polar Express and PJ's, Mother/ Son Dance, Community Luau, volunteer program and now Caroline Mentoring Project for The Caroline County Family YMCA, bringing with it a refreshing change to the way services are offered in the program. During the past few weeks Mr. Perez has been in communication with the public

schools of the county to create collaboration between each school and the program.

The program has 15 mentors and 17 mentees and we're working hard to increase both numbers.

The program has monthly meetings between the coordinator and the participants in the program, as well as monthly meetings with mentors that include trainings that will help the mentors during the period they are with the program. Part of the responsibility of the coordinator is to create educational events and activities that can strengthen the relationship between mentor and mentee. Each participant (mentor and mentee) has a YMCA individual membership each year.

We here at the YMCA, are very excited about Angel taking over the program as he's shown his commitment to the YMCA and its mission and to serve our community. He is a great relationship builder and we know he's going to do great things for these mentors, mentees, and their families.

The Caroline Mentoring Project focuses on the development of trusting relationships between caring adults and a youth, changing lives forever.

Updates on Ordinances and Resolutions

Resolution #860 - A resolution establishing a Fee Schedule for Parking Violations. Adopted 03/07/19.

Ordinance #697 - An ordinance amending or repealing and replacing various subsections of Section 120 of the Town of Denton Code, generally outlining parking restrictions for public streets within the Town of Denton and providing penalties for the violation thereof. Introduced 01/03/19, passed 03/07/19, effective 04/14/19.

Ordinance #698 - An ordinance amending Sections 128-8, 128-64, and 128-77 of the Town of Denton Code, generally outlining provisions for allowing residents to keep or maintain chickens as an accessory use within the Town of Denton and

providing penalties for the violation thereof. Introduced 04/04/19, to be considered 05/02/19.

Ordinance #699 - An ordinance to appropriate funds and estimate income in accordance with the budget adopted for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. Introduced 04/04/19, to be considered 05/02/19.

Special Collection Reminder

Household Items: All special collection items to be picked up on Wednesdays must be called in by 12 noon on Tues. Effective January 1, 2003, there is a \$5.00 collection fee for each item to be collected. This fee must be paid prior to pickup date.

Yard Waste: All bagged leaf and brush pickup requests must be called in by 12 noon on Tuesday for Wednesday pickup.

Call all requests in to the Town Office at 410-479-2050.

Attention Settlement Attorneys

Reminder to all settlement attorneys and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred within the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the residents of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

Please note: Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charged may be passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00 and after 3:30p.m., the fee is \$100.00. Forms are available to use when requesting information. Any questions, please call the Town of Denton at (410) 479-2050.

Service Fees for Utility Calls

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turn ons, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

Special Attention: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)
