Applicants are requested to submit their applications at least 60 days prior to their proposed event. This allows the Police and Public Works Departments to schedule employees to provide any assistance needed.

## Spring Loose Leaf Collection

The Town of Denton will be providing a special spring loose leaf collection service to vacuum up leaves that are left over from the fall. The Denton Public Works Department is scheduling their loose leaf removal service to occur on Monday April 11, Friday April 15, Monday April 18, Friday April 22, and Monday April 25, 2016. Leaves must be bagged for pickup the remaining months of the year.

Leaf vacuuming will occur on Friday and/or Monday pending work load. It will be necessary to call in your loose leaf vacuum pickup request by 12 NOON on Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday.

Bagged leaf collection will still take place on Wednesdays and must be called in to the town office by 12 NOON on Tuesdays.

Citizens are encouraged to call the Town Office at 410-479-2050 to request pickup. If calling after hours please leave the requests on the Town Office answering machine, ext. 1.

Please follow these guidelines for leaf removal:

- Rake leaves to the curbside or alley
- DO NOT rake leaves into the street
- DO NOT rake leaves onto the sidewalk
- Make sure all sticks and limbs are removed from the pile of leaves
- Make sure there are no other objects or debris mixed with the leaves (like bottles, cans, flowerpots, gloves, ashes, pet waste or other trash)
- Piles of leaves with sticks, limbs or other debris will not be picked up
- Phone in your pickup request to the Town Office at 410-479-2050 by Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday
- All pickups will be done by request/appointment only
- Loose leaf pickups will occur from April 11 through April 25, on Mondays and Fridays only. Leaves must be bagged any other time.

## **UTILITY BILL ALERT!**

Utility bills will be mailed around April 1, 2016. To avoid having your water turned off **payment must be received by April 25, 2016.** Payments can be made in person Monday - Friday from 8:30a.m. to 4:00p.m., by mail, or by placing it in the night drop box located to the left of the front door. Acceptable payment methods include cash, check, money order or cashier check. The next utility bills will be mailed around July 1, 2016 and will be due in full by July 25, 2016.



## Work Zone Awareness

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration more than 600 people were killed in highway workzone crashes across the country in 2012. Speeding in work zones is dangerous and was a factor in more than 35% of these fatal work-zone crashes. The safest thing drivers can do is pay attention when a work zone is up ahead. Drivers need to slow down when they see warning barricades, and signs, cones.

Work zone safety is important because work zones present an unfamiliar situation to drivers. Changes in traffic patterns, closed or narrowed lanes, and the presence

of construction e q u i p m e n t and personnel cause challenges for motorists as they travel work zones. Careful attention should be paid to actions that have

the potential to impact the safety of everyone involved, including drivers and their passengers, workers, and pedestrians. While safe and efficient work zones begin with proper planning, design, and implementation, drivers must be attentive to changing conditions and exercise caution when they approach and travel through a work

National Highway Traffic Safety Administration figures show that approximately 85 - 90% of work zone fatalities are motorists and their occupants. The driver plays a key role in making work zones safer for everyone, especially themselves. Crashes often occur when drivers exceed the work zone speed limit, fail to react to merging lanes or other road conditions, or run into other vehicles or heavy

equipment.

In the coming months as construction activity picks up, many sections of our nation's roads will be busy with workers and drivers. By following the rules of the road in work-zones, people will be safer.

## Rules for driving in work zones include:

- Pay attention to signs and other work zone safety devices. Things may change overnight. Normal speed limits may be reduced, traffic lanes may be closed, narrowed, or shifted, and people may be working on or near the road.
  - Slow down and be prepared

to merge safely when approaching a work zone.

Avoid rear-end collisions by maintaining a safe distance behind other vehicles. Rear-end collisions account for 30% of work

zone crashes.

- Avoid distractions so that you will be better prepared to respond to changing road conditions. Dedicate your full attention to the roadway and avoid changing radio stations or using cell phones and other electronic devices while approaching and driving in a work zone.
- When in a line of traffic, be patient and stay calm. Remember the work zone crew members are working to improve the road and make your future drive better.
  - Wear your seatbelt.
- Obey road crew flaggers and pay attention to the signs. They have the same authority as a regulatory sign. Ignore a flagger and you could be cited by a law enforcement officer.

## It's Boat Ramp Permit Season

Boating season is here. Just a reminder, effective April 1, 2009, a permit is required to launch any vessel, via boat trailer, at all Caroline County boat ramps and public landings.

Permits may be purchased for one day use or annual use and vary in price.

A one day pass for Maryland residents is \$5 and \$10 for out of state residents. Annual pass fees are \$20 for Maryland residents and \$50 for out of state residents. Annual permits are valid only when


displayed on the driver's side of the boat trailer tongue, within 12 inches of the hitch. Daily permits must be hung on the inside mirror facing the windshield. Fines for a first offense are \$50, and a second

offense is \$100.

#### **Attention Settlement Attorneys**

Reminder to all settlement attorneys and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred within the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the residents of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

Please note: Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charged may be passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00 and after 3:30p.m., the fee is \$100.00. Forms are available to use when requesting information. Any questions, please call the Town of Denton at (410) 479-2050.

#### **Service Fees for Utility Calls**

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turn ons, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

**Special Attention**: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)
