**PROCEEDINGS** 

**Call to Order:** 

The Planning Commission Meeting was called to order by Chairperson Walls at 6:00 p.m.,

on June 28, 2022, at the Denton Town Office. Chairperson Walls lead everyone in the Pledge of

Allegiance.

This Meeting was made available to the public via Zoom Video Conferencing, and access

to the meeting was made available on the Town website.

**Approval of Minutes:** 

April 26, 2022, the Regular Meeting Minutes, and May 10, 2022, the Working Session

Minutes were reviewed and unanimously approved.

Chairperson Walls moved to New Business #2, Critical Area Amendments.

New Business #2 – Ordinance No. 735/Critical Area Amendments:

The Critical Area Commission provided mandated updates to the Town for the Critical

Area Program from the last legislative session. Staff drafted Ordinance No. 735 with the required

amendments to the Critical Area Program.

Commissioner Mead motioned for the Planning Commission to approve the amendments

in Ordinance No. 735 for the Critical Area Program.

Mr. Mayer seconded the motion. The motion passed. (4:0:1)

Vice Chairperson Quick abstained.

There was discussion on recreational marijuana and medical marijuana.

Old Business #1 – Comprehensive Plan/Housing Element:

Peter Johnston provided a PowerPoint presentation on the Housing Element in the

Comprehensive Plan. Since the conditions for the Housing Element have not changed, there are

few changes to the update of the Housing Element.

Denton's goal is to provide opportunities for safe, decent, and affordable housing for all

citizens. The key objectives to address the community's housing needs are supporting private and

public initiatives to provide affordable housing and maintain existing housing.

Current sales data indicates that Denton and Caroline County housing prices are lower than

those of surrounding counties.

The Land Use Article of the Annotated Code requires the Housing Element to address

workforce and low-income housing. The workforce, low-income, and affordable housing criteria

are based on the Department of Housing and Urban Development Area Median Income. Based on

this criterion, over half of the population in Denton qualifies for the need of affordable housing.

Housing needs for the community also include the homeless, transitional, group housing,

and halfway housing. Ensuring appropriate locations for these housing types will need to be

addressed in the Zoning Code permitted uses.

Old Business #2 – Other: None.

New Business #1 – Robyn's Cay Alcohol & Tobacco LLC:

Robyn Ritter (Applicant) made the presentation for a liquor store to be located at the Power

Plaza, 601H North Sixth Street, Denton. The Applicant has signed a lease with the property owner

for five years. The property owner has contacted other businesses at the Power Plaza, and there

are no objections to this new business. The Applicant has applied for a liquor license. The

Applicant plans to have a security door attendant that will card people at the door, and no one

under 21 years of age is allowed in the liquor store.

Planning Commission Minutes June 28, 2022 At a later date, the Applicant plans to sell some food items and will seek Caroline County

Health Department approval. In addition, the refrigeration unit for the prepackaged food will need

to be approved by the Health Department.

The Applicant will sell tobacco products.

Chairperson Walls motioned that the Planning Commission approve the liquor store

conditioned upon a person on the premises to regulate admittance of 21 and over at peak times,

Caroline County Health Department approval of food items, and the Planning Commission shall

review any recreational license.

Mr. Mead seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. (5:0)

New Business #3 – Other:

None.

Staff Items #1 – Comprehensive Plan Working Session & Updates:

Two working sessions for the Comprehensive Plan were scheduled for September 13<sup>th</sup> and

October 11<sup>th</sup>.

Staff Items #2 – Staff Updates:

The MPCA Regional Workshop is scheduled for July 14<sup>th</sup>.
