Special Spring Loose Leaf Collection

The Town of Denton will be providing a special spring loose leaf collection service to vacuum up leaves that are left over from the fall. The Denton Public Works Department is scheduling their looseleaf removal service to occur on Monday April 1, Friday April 5, Monday April 8, Friday April 12, Monday April 15, and Friday April 19, Monday April 22, 2024. Leaves must be bagged for pickup the remaining months of the year.

Leaf vacuuming will occur on Friday and/or Monday pending workload. It will be necessary to call in your loose-leaf vacuum

UTILITY BILL ALERT!

Utility bills will be mailed around April 1, 2024. To avoid having your water turned off, **payment must be received by April 25, 2024.** Payments can be made in person Monday - Friday from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM, online, by mail, at our drive-thru window, or by placing it in the night drop box located to the left of the front door.

Acceptable payment methods include cash, check, money order or cashier check. You can also pay by credit card at the office or online. The next utility bill will be mailed around July 1, 2024, and will be due in full by July 25, 2024.



Rake leaves to the curbside or alley

- DO NOT rake leaves into the street
- DO NOT rake leaves onto the sidewalk
- Make sure all sticks and limbs are removed from the pile of leaves
- Make sure there are no other objects or debris mixed in with the leaves (like bottles, cans, flow-

erpots, gloves, ashes, pet waste or other trash)

 Piles of leaves with sticks, limbs or other debris will not be picked up

Phone in your pickup request to the Town Office at 410-479-2050 by Thursday to be picked up by Monday.

All pickups will be done by request/appointment only.

Loose leaf pickups will occur from April 1 through April 22, on Mondays and Fridays only. Leaves must be bagged any other time.

Bay Restoration Fund Exemption Procedures

The Town of Denton has established a program to exempt certain owneroccupied residential properties from the Bay Restoration Fee based on substantial financial hardship. In order to quality for this exemption, the applicant must meet at least (2) two of the following criteria:

- Receiving energy assistance subsidy.
- Receiving public assistance – supplemental security income (SSI) or food stamps.
- Receiving veterans or social security disability benefits.

Meeting the income criteria below:

Denton Main Street Hires New Director














- Complete the digital essay form entirely
- Each teacher must submit a digital entry form. No group forms or multiple teachers per form.
- You will receive access to a shareable Dropbox folder specific to your school's Maryland Municipal League District
- All essays must be combined into a single file
- Number each essay at top of page
- Word documents or PDF files only
- Handwritten essays may be scanned or sent via jpeg, as long as the scan/photo are combined into a single PDF file
- Name the combined essay file in the following manner
 - o School Name(dot)Teacher's Last Name(dot)Number of Essays within file
 - o EXAMPLE: FarmElementary.Mason.25
- Upload file into Dropbox Folder
- NEW INFORMATION: In late April, eleven regional winners along with their parents and teacher will be recognized during an awards ceremony.
- Only regional winners are notified directly.



The contest is open to all Maryland students enrolled in the 4th grade during the 2023-24 school year.

- All essays must be returned via digital method. Mailed entries will not be accepted.
- All essays must begin with the opening line: "If I Were Mayor, I Would..."
- Essays may not exceed 275 words.
- Only one essay may be submitted per student.
- Essays will be judged by contest sponsors in the following areas: essay relation to contest topic; displayed knowledge about municipal government and the role of a mayor; creativity; and proper use of grammar.
- Students must include their first and last names, school and teacher's name at the top of their essays.

NEW DEADLINE: Essays must be received no later than March 8, 2024

- Winners will be notified by early April. Runners up will be notified by mid-May.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND FORMS:

Complete the Bay Restoration Fee hardship exempt application form.

Check all boxes that apply. You must check at least two (2) boxes to qualify for an exemption.

Verification of any exemption criteria (proof of assistance, proof of income, etc.) must be presented with the completed application.

Sign and date the form and submit it with the verification document to Town of Denton, Attn: Clerk-Treasurer, 4 N. Second St., Denton, MD 21629.

Renewal applications shall be received by May 30th of each year.

REQUIRED SUPPORTING DOCU-MENTATION:

-Copy of tax bill.

-Proof the applicant is the owner and resides at the property.

– copy of energy bill.

-Copy of other documentation about receiving one of the above benefits.

EXEMPTION TIME-PERIOD:

ATTENTION OWNER OCCUPIED PROPERTY OWNERS: YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR A FINANCIAL HARDSHIP EXEMPTION FROM PAYING THE STATE OF MARYLAND'S BAY RESTORATION FEE (BRF)

Bay Restoration Fund Facts

In 2004, the State of Maryland took a major step to protect our waterways through the enactment of the Bay Restoration Fund (Senate Bill-320). The purpose of the bill was to create a dedicated fund to improve the environment and water quality of the Chesapeake Bay. Through an environmental surcharge fee, this fund is used to upgrade wastewater treatment plants, upgrade septic systems in the critical area, and implement cover crops on agricultural land. Approximate annual fee to the user \$30.00. SB320 also required all Municipalities to bill all properties through their Utility Billing and transmit the funds to the State.

During the 2012 State of Maryland Legislative Session came the adoption of Senate Bill 240, doubling the BRF. Effective July 1, 2012, the BRF was doubled for all property owners. For most, the fee is now \$60.00 a year. The Town of Denton began billing the new fees on the Utility Bills issued on Oct. 1, 2012, (for the July 1, 2012 – Sept. 30, 2012 billing cycle).

<u>Single Family Residential Home Owners</u> - saw a quarterly increase from \$7.50 per quarter to \$15.00 per quarter; annual increase from \$30.00 to \$60.00.

<u>Non-Residential/Commercial Owners</u> – the BRF is based on the number of EDU's and the total average daily water consumption. Minimum BRF will be \$15.00 per quarter/\$60.00 for a year.

<u>BRF Exemption Plan</u> – With the implementation of House Bill #446, another bill was adopted during the 2012 legislative session in which Municipalities are now required to establish a BRF Exemption Plan.

As a result, on February 7, 2013, The Denton Town Council took action an adopted Resolution #778, establishing a BRF Exemption Plan and Application.

Service Fees for Utility Calls

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turned on, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

Special Attention: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)

\$50.00 fee during normal business hours. \$100.00 fee after normal business hours.

Attention Settlement Attorneys

Reminder to all settlement attorney's and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred within the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the resident's of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

Please note: Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charge may be passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00, and after 3:30 PM, the fee is \$100.00.
