PROCEEDINGS

Call to Order:

The Historic and Architectural Review Commission Meeting was called to order

by Chairperson Mackel, at 6:00 p.m. on May 17, 2023, at the Denton Town Office,

leading everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

New Business #1 – For All Seasons/Projecting Signage:

Jonathan Qvarnstrom (Applicant) is requesting approval for a third projecting sign

at 322 Market Street. Denton Town Code, Chapter 128, Attachment 9:1, two projecting

signs are allowed for the two businesses with building frontage.

Mr. Qvarnstrom is requesting a variance based on Denton Town Code § 129-126 J

(2), an additional projecting sign requiring a variance from the Board of Appeals.

Mr. Qvarnstrom explained the desire to have a sign with the company logo on the

front of the building and how it will help new clients in locating the business.

Chairperson Mackel provided an additional picture clarifying the location, how the

projecting sign would be attached to the building, and how the signage would affect the

street view, stating that there appears to be ample space for the sign. She also noted the

colors were in harmony with the new color scheme of the renovated building.

Chairperson Mackel referenced the Historic Resource Coding, stating that the

building contributes to the significance of the district, but does not appear to be eligible

for the National Registry listing individually, making it acceptable. It was also noted that

the Board of Appeals would be holding a meeting on June 12th to review this request.

Vice Chairperson Goss motioned to approve the proposed projecting signage as

submitted.

Commissioner Lacoste seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. (3:0)
