Fall Loose Leaf Collection Schedule

Autumn is here and the leaves are beginning to fall. The Denton Public Works Department is scheduling their annual loose-leaf vacuuming removal service to occur Monday, October 14, 2024, through Friday, December 13, 2024. Leaves must be bagged for pickup the remaining months of the year.

Loose leaf vacuuming will occur on Friday and/or Monday, pending workload, and excluding holidays. It will be necessary to call in your loose-leaf vacuum pickup request by 12-NOON on Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday. We ask that you please only have one pile of leaves, and have it located at the edge of

your property, without obstructing sidewalks or roadways, where it can easily be accessed by Public Works staff.

Bagged leaf collection will still occur on Wednesdays and must be called in to the Town Office by 12-NOON on Tuesday.

Citizens are encouraged to call the Town Office at (410) 479-2050 to request pickup. If calling after hours, please leave the request on the Town Office answering machine, ext. 1.

Please follow these guidelines for leaf removal:

- Leaves should be raked to the curbside or alley.
- DO NOT rake leaves into the street.

UTILITY BILL ALERT!

Utility bills will be mailed around October 1, 2024. To avoid having your water turned off, payment must be received by October 25, 2024. Payments can be made in person, Monday - Friday, from 8:30a.m. to 4:00p.m., online, by mail, at our drive-thru window, or by placing it in the night drop box located to the left of the front door facing 2nd Street.

Acceptable payment methods include cash, check, money order or cashier check. You can also pay by credit card at the office or online. The next utility bill will be mailed around January 1, 2025, and will be due in full by January 25, 2025.

TOWN OF DENTON VOTER REGISTRATION FOR ELECTIONS

All citizens of the Town of Denton who have not registered to vote must do so in order to be eligible to vote in the Denton **November 5, 2024** Elections. Under the universal registration law, which went into effect January 1, 1990, any person registered to vote in Caroline County automatically becomes eligible to vote in the Denton Town Elections, if qualified under the regulations set forth in the Town of Denton Charter which are as follows:

Every person who is a citizen of the United States, is at least eighteen (18) years of age, <u>has resided within the corporate limits of the Town for thirty (30) days</u> preceding any Town election, and is registered with the Board of Elections Supervisors for Caroline County, and registered in accordance with the provisions of this charter and town ordinances, shall be a qualified voter of the Town. Transfers may be granted by the registration officials from one ward to another in said Town. No person shall be entitled to register on Election Day. Every qualified voter of the town shall be entitled to vote at any or all elections.

Voter registration is available Monday through Friday during normal working hours (9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) at the Caroline County Board of Elections, Caroline Health and Public Services Building, at 403 South Seventh Street, Denton. Forms may be requested by calling the election office at (410) 479-8145, completed and mailed to the Board of Elections Offices.

PLEASE NOTE: The last date to register to vote in the Town of Denton is November 5, 2024, election is Friday, October 4, 2024.




During the July 11, 2024 Town Council Meeting, Mayor Abby McNinch swore in Patrolman Shirkey and Patrolman Barnett.

- DO NOT rake leaves onto the sidewalk.
- Make sure all sticks and limbs are removed from the pile of leaves.
- Make sure there are no other objects or debris mixed with the leaves (like bottles, cans, flowerpots, gloves, ashes, pet waste, or other trash).
- Piles of leaves with sticks, limbs, or other debris will not be picked up.
- Phone in your pickup request to the Town

Office at (410) 479-2050 by Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday.

- All pickups will be done by request/appointment only.
- Loose leaf pickups will occur from Oct. 14 through Dec. 13, on Mondays and Fridays only, except for holidays.





Special Collection Reminder

Household Items: All special collection items, to be picked up on Wednesdays, must be called in by 12-noon on Tuesday. Effective January 1, 2003, there is a \$5.00 collection fee for each item to be collected. This fee must be paid prior to pick up date. Reminder that all mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic and sealed with tape.

Is a Special Event Permit Need?

Are you or an organization you are a part of planning to have an event in downtown that will use a town-owned piece of property or close a road? If you answer is yes, then you need to fill out a Special Event Permit.

This form is available online at www.dentonmaryland.com/news/road-closures-specialevents/.

If you are looking to see if an event is coming within town limits that will close a road, this information is on the website as well, below the special event permit info.

If you would like to have a Special Event and need a portion of a street closed off, please fill out the form and return it to the Denton Police Department at 100 N Third St. Denton, MD 21629.

Special Event forms should be turned in 45 days (or more) prior to your event. If your event is less than 45 days away, please contact the Denton Police Dept. first at (410)-479-1414.

If you wish to use the Community Demonstration Garden at 4th and Gay St., please contact Denton Main Street at 410-924-2328.



ABSENTEE BALLOTS REQUEST FOR DENTON TOWN ELECTION

Any Denton Town Resident, otherwise qualified to vote in Town, desiring to vote in the Town Election being held on November 5, 2024, as an Absentee Voter, shall make application in writing to the Town Clerk requesting an Absentee Ballot as per the Denton Town Code:

Chapter 10 - Elections, Article I - Absentee Voting

Applications to request an absentee ballot must be sent to the Town Clerk for receipt on or before:

October 18, 2024 if by mail November 1, 2024, if delivered in person

Absentee Ballot Applications are available on the Town's website at www.dentonmaryland.com or at the Town Office, located at 4 N. Second St. All requests must be submitted in writing and include the voter's name, residence address, signature of the voter, and the address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if different from the residence address.

Once the Application for an Absentee Ballot is approved, the ballot and instructions will be mailed to the applicant two weeks prior to the election or hand-delivered to the qualified voter if the application is presented in person to the Town Clerk between October 18, 2024, and November 1, 2024.

<u>All absentee ballots must be returned to the Denton Town Office</u>, Attn: Supervisors of Elections, 4 North Second Street, Denton, Maryland 21629, <u>before the closing of the polls (8:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 5, 2024)</u>. Instructions must be followed in order to be considered valid.

NOTICE OF DENTON TOWN ELECTION AND FILING BY CANDIDATES

Tuesday, November 5, 2024, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

There will be an election held this date for the purpose of electing one Town Council member to fulfill a five year term. All persons desiring to become a candidate for the Town Council shall have resided in the Town at least one year prior to election, shall be a registered voter of the Town of Denton, shall be at least 25 years of age, and shall file in accordance with the Denton Charter, Article V, Section C5-8, which reads in part as follows:

Candidates for election to the office of the Denton Town Council shall file with the Board of Supervisors of Elections a petition signed by at least twenty (20) registered voters of the Town of Denton. The candidate shall file the petition for an elective office not less than thirty (30) days, including Sundays and holidays, prior to the date of such election. Such petition shall state the name and address of the candidate, the fact that such person is eligible for election of the office of council, and that such person wishes his/her name placed on the ballot as candidate. Such petition shall be sworn to by the person filing same, both as to the fact of the candidate's eligibility and as to the genuineness of the signatures on such petition. The Board of Supervisors of Elections shall advertise the filing requirements once weekly for one (1) month prior to the filing deadline in a paper circulated in the Town. No person shall be eligible for elective Town public office who has not fulfilled the requirements of this Section.

A further requirement for candidates for election is found in Section 14-4 (D) of the Town of Denton Ethics Code. Petitions of candidacy will not be accepted by the Town of Denton or the Board of Election Supervisors unless the certificate is accompanied by a complete financial disclosure statement complying with the Town of Denton Ethics Code.

The petition of candidacy and the completed financial disclosure statement must be delivered to the Denton Town Office, at 4 N. Second St., Denton, by 4:00 p.m., Friday, October 4, 2024. It is suggested that the petition be returned several hours prior to the 4:00 p.m. deadline so the names of the signers of the petition may be verified as registered voters. This will provide ample time to obtain additional signatures should any of the signatures prove to be invalid. Petition forms have been prepared for the convenience of the candidates filing and may be obtained www.dentonmaryland.com or at the Denton Town Office during normal working hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday except for holidays).

Cycling and Kayaking

Caroline Cycles: This September Caroline Cycles travels to the C&O for two events. From September 1-4, riders will cycle the canal trail from Washington DC to Cumberland MD. Participants will arrange their own transportation and lodging. This trip is for experienced distance riders. Three shorter rides will occur later in the month on the trail.

On Saturday, September 14 at 10:30 AM, riders will meet at the National Park Service (NPS) Visitor Center Parking Lot at 205 Potomac Street Williamsport, MD to ride from Williamsport, (milepost 99.4) to Big Slack Water, (milepost 85.6). Big Slackwater is 2.7 miles long and is a concrete path on the edge of the river with the cliffs rising on the other side. It is very scenic.

On Sunday, September 15 at 9:00AM, we will meet at the same location as the day before. We will ride from Williamsport, (milepost 99.4) to Fort Frederick State Park (Milepost 112.1). At Fort Frederick State Park cyclists will leave the trail and take a park road where they will be able to tour the Fort, stop into the gift shop for snacks, use the restrooms and/or eat lunch. Then we will return to Williamsport.

On Monday, September 16, cyclists will meet at Lock 38 Shepherdstown, WV Parking Lot at 10:30 AM. The parking lot is by the Potomac River Bridge. Cyclists will ride to Harpers Ferry, WV on the C&O Canal. Cyclists will plan to have lunch and explore the Harpers Ferry National Historical Park before heading back. Helmet, bike light, water, lights, tubes, snacks and tools are required. Call 410-924-1529 to register.

Evening Cycle: Meet every week at 5:30 PM for a 10 mile bike ride at either Tuckahoe or Martinak State Park. This ride is open to those who ride 10 mph and designed for cyclists new to road riding. Service Fees for Utility Calls

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turned on, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

Special Attention: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)

\$50.00 fee during normal business hours. \$100.00 fee after normal business hours.

Attention Settlement Attorneys

Reminder to all settlement attorney's and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred within the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the resident's of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

Please note: Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charge may be passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently, the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00, and after 3:30 PM, the fee is \$100.00.
