# Denton Town News

### Here are some helpful tips to keep you and your home safe during this winter season.

To keep your pipes from freezing, turn off all outside spigots and insulate the pipes to protect them from the freezing temperatures.

To prevent water damage in your home, in the event your experience a burst pipe, locate all the water shut off valves. Don't wait for someone else to turn it off. The delay could cause major water damage.

For snow removal in the town, streets will not be plowed unless there is a 2inch accumulation. The snow removal equipment cannot withstand clearing

### UTILITY BILL ALERT!

Utility bills will be mailed around January 1, 2025. To avoid having your water turned off, **payment must be received by January 25, 2025.** Payments can be made in person, Monday - Friday, from 8:30a.m. to 4:00p.m., online, by mail, at our drive-thru window, or by placing it in the night drop box located to the left of the front door facing 2nd Street.

Acceptable payment methods include cash, check, money order or cashier check. You can also pay by credit card at the office or online. The next utility bill will be mailed around April 1, 2025, and will be due in full by April 25, 2025.

### Winter Weather Tips

the street for a trace of snow.

When shoveling out your driveway, pile the snow in your yard, not in the streets, and always pile it to the left side of your driveway. This prevents the snow from being pushed back in your driveway from plowing streets.

During snow storms, park as many cars as you can in the driveway to make snow removal easier. It may also prevent your vehicle from being damaged by other vehicles on the roads.

**EMERGENCY ROUTES** are a priority when removing snow. Secondary roads and alleys are last. You must be patient. The crews will get to your area as soon as possible.

Lastly, your safety and the safety of our snow removal crews are our number one concern. Let's do all we can to keep everyone out of harm's way!



## Fall Loose Leaf Collection Days

Autumn is here and the leaves are beginning to fall. The Denton Public Works Department is scheduling their annual loose-leaf vacuuming removal service to occur Monday, October 14, 2024, through Friday, December 13, 2024. Leaves must be bagged for pickup the remaining months of the year.

Loose leaf vacuuming will occur on Friday and/or Mon-

day, pending workload, and excluding holidays. It will be necessary to call in your looseleaf vacuum pickup request by 12-NOON on Thursday to guar-

antee pickup by Monday. We ask that you please only have one pile of leaves, and have it located at the edge of your property, without obstructing sidewalks or roadways, where it can easily be accessed by Public Works staff.

Bagged leaf collection will still occur on Wednesdays and must be called in to the Town Office by 12-NOON on Tuesday.

Citizens are encouraged to call the Town Office at (410) 479-2050 to request pickup. If calling after hours, please leave the request on the Town Office answering machine, ext. 1.

#### Please follow these guidelines for leaf removal:

• Leaves should be raked to the curbside or alley.

• DO NOT rake leaves into the street.

• DO NOT rake leaves onto the sidewalk.

• Make sure all sticks and limbs are removed from the pile of leaves.

Make sure there are no other objects or debris mixed with the leaves (like bottles, cans, flowerpots, gloves, ashes, pet waste, or other trash).

• Piles of leaves with sticks, limbs, or other debris will not be picked up.

• Phone in your pickup request to the Town Office at (410) 479-2050 by Thursday to guarantee pickup by Monday.

• All pickups will be done by request/appointment only.

• Loose leaf pickups will occur from Oct. 14 through Dec. 13, on Mondays and Fridays only, except for holidays.

### SNOW PLOW POLICY INFORMATION

Planning for a winter storm event can be difficult. The variations in rate of snowfall, moisture content, air/ surface temperatures, time of day, and wind velocity make each storm unique.

The purpose of this policy is to clarify and describe the Town's snow plowing and sanding priorities and the level of service that is intended to be provided by Town forces. The Town does not guarantee that streets will be free of snow and ice after plowing and/or sanding. Bare, dry pavement should not be expected. The Town will attempt to maintain adequate traction for vehicles properly equipped for winter driving conditions.

It is the goal of this effort to establish general policies and procedures that help make travel within the Town as safe as possible and to minimize economic hardship.


### AQSG Medallion Exhibit

This exhibit is a collection of quilts from the AQSG 2021 Quilt Study challenge. The AQSG Quilt Study challenged members to learn the history of an individual quilt by selecting one that addresses a specified design, style, or period, and make a small replica or interpretation of the historic quilt.

These quilts are no larger than 42" x 42". Framed Center /Medallion Quilts was the study theme for the 2021 challenge. These quilts cover a time period ranging from the early 19th century to the mid 20th century. Come and join us as we take a deeper look at the history of these amazing medallions!



Healthy Parks, Healthy People November 2024

It's easy to stay indoors in the cooler months but getting outside breathing in fresh air and exercising will improve your mind and body. Check out one of our hiking or cycling programs. Another new program that began in October is Senior Rangers. Senior Rangers are well underway but there are three more sessions to take advantage of this season. This program is geared toward senior citizens with an interest in learning more about our parks and nature. The sessions are led by a variety of knowledgeable instructors including rangers, historians, naturalists, and other Department of Natural Resources experts. Check out the listing below for more information on dates, topics and time.

### New Programs

**Senior Rangers:** This program is geared toward senior citizens (+55) with an interest in learning more about our parks and nature so they can get active, visit their local state parks, and sharpen their sense of wonder! Three weekly sessions will be held in November. Sessions are led by a variety of instructors including rangers, historians, naturalists, and other Department of Natural Resources experts. All sessions meet Wednesday morning at 10:00am. Sessions include Native Plant Benefits and Walk, Old Growth Forest Discussion and Walk and Aviary Tour. Meeting locations vary each week among Tuckahoe State Park, Wye Island Natural Resource Management Area and Adkins Arboretum. Prior to the start of the session, all participants will be emailed a welcome letter with any updates on program specifics.

### Service Fees for Utility Calls

All calls for utility service for properties located in the Town of Denton are assessed the following service fee. This fee applies for all water shut off/turned on, and other miscellaneous calls for service. Paying utility bills on time can help the property owner avoid these fees.

Special Attention: Any water that is turned off will be assessed this fee to have the water turned back on. Tenants will need to pay this fee before water service is turned back on. (This may not apply for emergency situations pending the nature of the call.)

### **Attention Settlement Attorneys**

Reminder to all settlement attorney's and agencies to please contact the Denton Town Office for fees due to the Town when handling settlements for properties being sold or transferred within the Town limits. There may be water/sewer fees or miscellaneous charges that need to be collected at the time of settlement. This will keep the Town's records up to date and better serve the resident' of the Town of Denton. This will also eliminate problems after settlement of any outstanding balances for the new property owner.

**Please note:** Any property that transfers ownership and the utility fees are not collected at settlement and forwarded to the town that result in the water being turned off for non-payment, the water turn on fee will still be charged. This charge may be passed on to the settlement attorney. Currently, the fee to turn water service back on during regular business hours is \$50.00, and after 3:30 PM, the fee is \$100.00.
